Bucharest: background information

Bucharest is the beautiful and vibrant capital city of Romania, situated on the banks of the Dambovitza River. In the period between the two World Wars, the city's elegant architecture, wide boulevards, and many parks, earned Bucharest the nickname of "Little Paris". Today, Bucharest is the cultural, industrial and financial heart of Romania, and the city has many educational facilities, cultural venues, shopping arcades and recreational areas. If you have never visited Bucharest, now is the time to do so.

The Erasmus course will take place in the building of Faculty of Medicine of "Carol Davila" University of Medicine and Pharmacy. The University it was initially established in 1857 under the name "National School of Medicine and Pharmacy" by the French expatriate physician, Carol Davila. The Faculty of Medicine is the place where insulin was isolated for the first time by Nicolae Paulescu in 1921.

Travel from Bucharest "Henri Coanda" International Airport:

- the 783 Express line connects the Airport with the city center;
- by car, the distance to city center is approximately 16,5 km.
